

A Silver Cup, presented by Mr. and Mrs. Warrington will be awarded to the Member exhibiting the best collection of Carnations. To be held for one year.

A Copper Bowl, Floating Trophy will be awarded to the Member exhibiting the best Selection of Dahlias. To be held for one year.

6. OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBITS. Each exhibit shall be considered as belonging to the individual under whose name the exhibit is entered.

7. ADMISSION. Only bona fide competitors and such assistants as necessary for the arrangement of their exhibits, will be admitted to the Show is open to the public and all exhibitors must leave the Hall by 12 noon.

Charge for admission is 1/- and children 6d.

Tea will be served throughout the afternoon at 1/- per head.

8. JUDGING. No persons other than the Officials of the Show may be in the Hall during the judging.

9. LIABILITY FOR LOSS. All exhibits, personal property etc, will be at the risk of the exhibitor, and the Society will not be liable for compensation for loss or damage by theft, fire, water, accident or any other cause whatsoever. At packing up time (6 p.m. on the day of the Show) exhibitors must have provided themselves with sufficient help to ensure the safety of their goods as it is impossible for the officers of the Society to be in all parts of the Hall at one and the same time.

10. SALE OF EXHIBITS. Any member wishing to sell his Exhibits or dispose of them for the benefit of the Society, is asked to inform the Secretary at time of entry.

11. INFORMATION. The Services of the Secretary will be available on the day of the Show, and all enquiries should be addressed to N. B. Exhibitors for prizes must conform strictly to the regulations in this leaflet.

CONDITIONS OF SHOW

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

1. ENTRIES Entry Fee for Exhibits is 6d per item, and all cards must be in the hands of the Secretary three days before the Show. A late entry fee of 3d per item will be charged in addition to the 6d. entry fee.
2. STAGING. All Exhibits must be staged by 12 noon after which time the doors will be closed. Any exhibits not in by 12 o'clock are disqualified.
3. RULES FOR EXHIBITS.
 - (a) Exhibitors are allowed to make more than one entry in any class on payment of the ordinary fee, but no exhibit may compete in two classes.

- (b) Exhibitors must please collect a card from the Steward for each entry before placing.
 - (c) Roses: Leaves should be shown with each bloom.
 - (d) Wild and Garden Flowers must NOT be mixed except in Classes 11 and 14 where it is permissible.
 - (e) Cut Flowers: No greenery must be shown in the vases with the blooms (other than belonging to the flowers shown, such as Carnations, Delphiniums etc.)
 - (f) The Children's Classes will be divided into age groups - from school going age to 10 years, and from 11 years to 15 years. This does not apply to the Photography Section.
 - (g) A table will be at the disposal of children. It is requested that the young exhibitors arrange their vases at this table.
 - (h) Miniature Gardens may be arranged at home without Supervision.
 - (i) All Bread exhibited must have been cooked the day before the Show.
 - (j) Cardboard Plates will be provided by the Society for all Bread, Cake and Sweet entries.
 - (k) In the Knitting and Sewing Sections, garments may be washed but must NOT have been worn or used.
 - (l) All photographs will be taken by Exhibitor.
4. TIME OF SHOW. The time of the Opening of the show will be 3 p. m. Prizes will be presented at 3. 45 p. m.
 5. CUPS. The Society's Cup will be awarded to the member gaining the most first prizes in the Show. The Cup to be held for 1 year when a miniature cup will be presented by the Society.

The Lady MacLaughlan Cup will be awarded to the Member gaining most points in the Rose Classes. The Cup to be held for one year.

A Cup, presented by Mrs. Brigham, will be awarded to the member winning the Cut Flower Class. To be held for one year.

A Cup, presented by Mrs. Laskie, will be awarded to the member winning the class for Berry Fruits. To be held for 1 year.
